

To all to Whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

Whereas, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Leadville, Colorado,
has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant, to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of
A. Clark L. Asaett
has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Section sixteen in Township
fourteen south of Range seventy-six west of the Sixth Principal
Meridian, Colorado, containing six hundred forty acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said claimant, the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant, and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant, forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of Courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States; reserving, also, to the United States all coal in the lands granted, and to it, or persons authorized by it, the right to prospect for, mine, and remove coal from the same upon compliance with the conditions of and subject to the limitations of the

Excepting and reserving, however, to the United States all the coal and other minerals in the lands so entered and patented, together with the right to prospect for, mine, and remove the same, pursuant to the provisions and limitations of the Act of December 29, 1916 (39 Stat. 862)

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Calvin Coolidge, President of the

United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
