This permit is issued under the provisions of S. C. Code Ann. Section 48-39-10, et seq., and 23A S.C. Code Ann. Regs. 30-1 through 30-18 (Supp. 2003). Please carefully read the project description and any special conditions that may appear on this permit/certification as they will affect the work that is allowed. If there are no special conditions, then the work is authorized as described in the project description and as modified by the general conditions. The general conditions are also a part of this permit/certification and should be read in their entirety. The S. C. Contractor's Licensing Act of 1999, enacted as S.C. Code Ann. Section 40-11-5 through 430, requires that all construction with a total cost of \$5,000 or more be performed by a licensed contractor with a valid contractor's license for marine class construction, except for construction performed by a private landowner for strictly private purposes. Your signature on and acceptance of this permit denotes your understanding of the stated law regarding use of licensed contractors. All listed special and general conditions will remain in effect for the life of the project if work commences during the life of the permit. This applies to permittee, future property owners, or permit assignees.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT, AS AUTHORIZED

The plans submitted by you, attached hereto, show the work consists of the following: constructing a private dock. The proposed structure will have a 4'x950' walkway with handrails leading to 16'x16' covered fixed pierhead with a 2'x5' sink. Channelward of the pierhead will be a 4'x32' ramp leading to a 10'x32' floating dock. To the right of the floating dock will be a 12'x13'. 4 pile boatlift. The purpose for the dock is for the property owner's private, recreational use.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- Provided that an as-built survey of the dock must be submitted to the Department within 90 days of the expiration date of the final construction placard. The survey must be performed by a registered land surveyor, must show all components of the dock, and must list the starting and ending coordinates of the dock walkway in the SC State Plane Coordinate System, which can be obtained by survey-grade Global Positioning System equipment.
- Provided that the dock and/or erosion control device, as applicable, not be constructed until final approval is received from Beaufort County. Proof of this approval must be brought to OCRM prior to construction authorization or issuance of the construction placard.
- 3. Provided that the pierhead (or boatlift) is not enclosed nor screened and the roof may be constructed as a Hip style roof. No part of the roof or attached structure may exceed 12' above the floor decking of the dock to the highest point of the roof including any ornamental structures.
- Provided that the total structure does not exceed 1000'.
- 5. Provided that in the event that archaeological or paleontological remains are found during the course of work, the applicant should notify the South Carolina Institute of Archaeology and Anthropology (Mr. James Spirck at 803-777-8170) pursuant to South Caroline Underwater

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Antiquities Act of 1991, (Article 5 Chapter 7, Title 54, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976). Archaeological remains consist of any materials made or altered by man, which remain from past historic or prehistoric times (ic, older than 50 years). Examples include old pottery fragments, metal, wood, arrowheads, stone implements or tools, human burials. historic docks, structures, or non-recent vessel remains.
