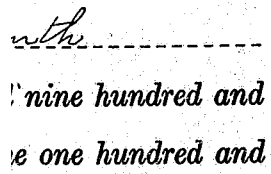

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

To all to Whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

Wherran, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lendville, Colorado, has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant, to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1892, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of James H. Pauly has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section ten and the north half of the northwest quarter and the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of Section eleven in Township fourteen South of Range seventy-two West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Colorado, containing one hundred sixty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General: NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said claimant... the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant... and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant... forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes; and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of Courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, Warren G. Harding, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. GIVEN under my hand, in the District of Columbia, the Fifteenth day of AUGUST, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and Twenty-one, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and Forty-Sixth.
