

## CP-1 & 2 Maintenance of Existing Permanent Grasses and Legumes Conservation Practice Implementation Requirements (IR)

Natural Resources Conservation Service, Texas

CRP

May 2022

### Definition

This job sheet is for the maintenance of an existing stand of native or introduced grasses and legumes.

### Purpose

Permanent grasses and legumes are used to reduce soil erosion and sedimentation, improve water quality and quantity and create or enhance wildlife habitat. Plantings may provide food, cover and shelter for wildlife where forbs or legumes are included in the mix.

### Where Used:

Permanent native and introduced grasses and legumes are applied to fields that meet CRP program eligibility as determined by the Farm Service Agency.

### Specifications:

Conservation cover will be maintained according to the offered CRP environmental benefit points per CRP contract.

### Operation and Maintenance (O&M):

Operation and maintenance is required to ensure all conservation practices are functioning properly and will be conducted as needed. **O&M activities shall not be conducted during the primary nesting periods – March 1 – July 1.**

1. Example O&M practices include:

- Control annual weeds, insects and other pests as described below in the Weed & Pest Management Specifications section.
- Prevent disturbance of cover during the primary nesting season as established by FSA (March 1 – July 1).
- Control all noxious weeds as identified by state and local laws, by: a) treating with chemicals per label directions , or b) spot mow before seed heads form. When possible delay use of control measures until after July 1st to protect nesting wildlife. Spot treatment on problem areas may be authorized by FSA during the primary nesting season.
- Protect the acres from unauthorized haying and grazing year round. Fences may need to be constructed and maintained to exclude livestock throughout all 12 months of the year. Refer to the haying and grazing management plan for specifications.
- Re-seed any areas that do not have adequate permanent cover.
- Do not use the contract area for field borders, field roads or other uses that will damage or destroy the cover.
- Do not use the field for disposal of livestock or organic waste unless that use is authorized in the additional specifications and remarks.
- Grassland management actions (i.e.; prescribed burning, haying, etc.) are beneficial during the contract to remove

CP2 Conservation Cover (327) -Acceptable Grass, Forb & Legume Cover

Sept

2023

Existing grass, forb or legume cover meets ranking requirements for CRP contract. The grass stand shall be maintained for the life of CRP-1, see the CRP-1 for the specific contract years.

Weeds and other pest shall be managed as needed to protect the established grass stand. The most common pest problem in established grass stands is weed encroachment.

Herbaceous Weed Control (315)-Mowing

Sept

2023

Weeds shall be mowed to manage undesirable plants as needed. This practice shall be applied non-cost shared and is scheduled to be maintained each year of the contract.

A contract management item will be required to be completed within the first 6 years of a 10 year contract; or within the first 9 years of a 15 year contract to comply with CRP requirements. Approved cover must be established before the contract management can begin and the contract management practice must be completed by the end of Year 6 or 9 respectively.

Early Successional Hab Dev/Mgt (647)-Mowing - MCMNOCSMOW

Sept

2027

Mow grasses to a minimum height of 6-18 inches (as specified on the implementation sheet by the NRCS) depending on existing cover. Mowing will be completed on 20% of each field under contract. Mowing will be performed in a series of strips throughout the field. Perform at least 1 time after 3rd year of contract and before end of year 6 for 10-year contracts and before end of year 9 for 15- year contracts; Only mow once every 3 yrs.; Alternate mowed areas to promote habitat diversity.
