Whereas, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Denver, Colorado, dated May 20, 1909, "To Secure Homestead in Actual Possession in the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim originally filed by J. W. Williams in 1876 has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 30, 1909, "To Secure Homestead in

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returning to the Chief of the Survey of the said land, returned to the (MINERAL LAND) OFFICE by the Surveyor-General

Now, I know, Yes, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said claimant, the tract of land above described, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said claimant, and to the heirs and assigns of the said claimant; nevertheless, subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights of ditches and reservoirs in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right in way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States, excepting and reserving, however, to the United States all the coal and other minerals in the lands so entered and patented, together with the right to prospect for, mine, and remove the same pursuant to the provisions and limitations of the "Act of October 3, 1918," (36 Stat., 2264, 2265, 2266).

These letters to the United States, and the seal of the General Land Office to the Bureau of Land Management, have been forwarded to the Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, Washington, D. C.
