Know all men by these Presents.
 That I, Asa Smith of Mattawamkeag, County of Penobscot, State of Maine in consideration of Ten Dollars paid by Trustees of the M. E. Church at said Mattawamkeag, namely Asa Smith, J. H. Hamilton + J. S. Parker of Mattawamkeag the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Trustees in trust that said premises shall be used, kept, maintained + disposed of as a place of divine worship for the use of the ministry + membership of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America subject to the Discipline, usage + ministerial appointments of said Church as from time to time authorized + declared by the General Conference of said Church + the Annual Conference in whose hands the said premises are situated their successors + assigns forever a certain lot or parcel of land situated in Mattawamkeag, bounded as follows viz: Commencing at the South East ^{corner} of Tavern lot formerly Deeded to George Parks now occupied by Strattons, and on the road leading to the Depot of the C. + N. A. Railway Co. thence running North $27^{\circ}30'$ East 100 feet on the line of said lot to a Stake, thence South 60° East 100 feet to a stake, thence South $27^{\circ}30'$ West 100 feet to a stake on the line of said road, thence Westerly on the line of the said road 100 feet to the first named bound as surveyed by Saml W. Boones. The grantees to build and maintain a good and lawfull fence on the two exterior lines of said lot that now have no fence.
